Participants

Out of 88 applicants, 25 participants were selected, based on their potential to engage in broadband policy discourse, interest in the subject and previous experience. Diversity was also a factor that was taken into account as this course is an interactive course where participants are expected to learn from each other. A program manager of accessibility from the Centre for Internet and Society who is visually impaired herself was able to highlight the importance of ICT accessibility. The following charts show the participants according to their disciplines, gender and region. While 46% was from a law background, they were in different stages of the career and were studying law from diverse angles (including lawyers, lecturers, students, and those working at civil society organizations such as Centre for Internet and Society).
