

HOW TO ENGAGE IN BROADBAND POLICY AND REGULATORY PROCESSES

OBJECTIVE

The objective of the course is to produce discerning and knowledgeable consumers of research who are able to engage in broadband policy and regulatory processes.

At the end of the course attendees will:

- Be able to find and assess relevant research & evidence
- Be able to summarize the research in a coherent and comprehensive manner
- Have an understanding of broadband policy and regulatory processes in Sri Lanka

WHO MAY APPLY

We will be selecting 20-25 participants (including junior – mid level officers of government and regulatory agencies, university students, lecturers, academics, telecenter operators and media personnel). This course is of topical value in light of imminent changes in Sri Lanka's laws and policies pertaining to broadband. Simultaneous interpretation facilities will be available. Ability to access and use the Internet for learning assignments is a precondition.
