Juni Soehardjo had working experience in several sectors, e.g. drilling company (Mainline Resources Pte Ltd), journalism (Femina Magazine), brokerage company for stock exchange (PT Nomura Indonesia), consumer products (The Walt Disney Company Singapore Pte Ltd), before settling in the infocomm sector. Her focus has been in telecommunications, broadcasting, media law and to some extent cybercrime law. She graduated from Law School of University of Indonesia, where she got her degree in economic law.

She has a certificate of ACCS – or Accredited Cyber Crime Studies from STMIK Perbanas. She is also one of people assigned as source person by ID-SIRTII (Indonesian Security Incident Response Team on Internet Infrastructure) when it was established. She has the equivalent of a master's degree level due to her extensive knowledge of the ICT sectors.

In 2009 she was a short-listed candidate to head the telecommunications sector as a BRTI Commissioner—she was one of the 10 shortlisted candidates (5 were chosen as Commissioners). The process to head the Telecommunication Authority was quite rigorous and took 3 months. She passed aptitude, psychological, and health tests.

She is the only female member of Board of Commissioners (Dewan Pembina) of YKBK – a Christian publishing company since 2008. She is active in the institution since 2002.

Below is a more detailed description of the positions she's held.

Executive Director, 2009 – present, for KADIN (Indonesian Chambers of Commerce and Industry) on Telecommunication, IT, and Media (ICT) Sector Supporting Unit, Jakarta, Indonesia

Assist Anindya N Bakrie, Vice President of KADIN on Telecommunication, IT and Media (ICT Sector). Her work focuses on:

- establishing a new office for the VP's supporting unit. This effort includes cooperating with various parties (including Anindya's own companies), formulating layout and interior concept of office, liaising with interior designer, as well as other institutions. The job also requires good administrative effort to run this brand new office.
- building a network and coordination amongst Anindya's 25 committee members as well as establishing groundwork to communicate between KADIN's Central Secretariat, Anin's own staff, and Anin's own ICT supporting unit.
- starting office's research and development role of the sectors (still in the preliminary stage) with focus on database collection, future maps, sector profiling and mapping.
- formulating the sector's RoadMap 2010-2015 requested by KADIN Indonesia, which was submitted to the President of Indonesia's office, the Cabinet and other major stakeholders. I edited papers based on discussions and papers deliberated by KADIN's own ICT Committee Members which subsequently was formulated into a full document.
- providing pointers, speeches and preparing presentations for the Vice President of KADIN in both Indonesian and English for major and minor events.
- organizing events, including formulating Terms of Reference for KADIN's ICT sector, coordinating and managing resources amongst several parties e.g. Vice President's own office, his companies, KADIN's own supporting unit, and other third parties to organize joint-efforts, seminars and workshops
- maintaining good relationship and building a network within Government circles – especially in the ICT Ministry – and keeping an eye on current trends, as well as reviewing drafts of regulations
- maintaining a network with legislative institutions (DPR).
- maintaining a network with non-ministry governmental institutions such as BPS, LIPI, PPATK, ID-SIRTII, Attorney General Offices, etc.

- maintaining and building a network with international institutions such as National University of Singapore and Sri Lankan research organization LIRNEasia
- maintaining and building a network with NGOs in the telecommunication, broadcasting and media sectors

Researcher, 2006 – present, Research Fellow with LIRNEasia – an infocomm research company based in Colombo, Sri Lanka.

In her work with MASTEL, an infocomm association, she performed the following strategic roles:

- served as member of Telecommunication Law Study established by BRTI (Badan Regulasi Telekomunikasi Indonesia) on convergence blue-print, which then developed into a white-paper for future Draft of Convergence Bill.
- served as member of various working groups, including Telecommunications Law Revision WG, Blue Print of ICT WG, Broadcasting WG, Alternative Dispute Solutions WG (2000-2009)

- served as person in charge of MASTEL programs, among others:
 - Working Group for Broadcasting Bill and its executing regulations,
 - Working Group for Universal Service Obligation,
 - Working Group for Electronic Information and Transaction Bill
 - Working Group for Convergence Bill

Being in charge of MASTEL programs meant she had to formulate drafts of TOR, invite potential resource persons to participate in the working groups, provide time-line, arrange meetings, actively contact WG members, take minutes of meetings, edit report drafts and finished report, oversee proceedings, advise Board of Office Bearers, arrange meetings with Ministry and/or other high ranking officials and upload any papers in MASTEL's websites.

- served as person in charge of publishing and editing articles and formulation of papers to be submitted to government (as well as preparing English version) on issues considered urgent and which were not part of WGs.
- served as person in charge of association newsletter, writing and publishing Annual Reports (2000 – 2006), which also included publishing details with publishers and finding donors and sponsors for Annual Reports.
- served as liaison and representative of MASTEL at both national and international levels.,
- drafted legal contracts and acted as in-house lawyer
- organized MASTEL annual meetings and National Assembly from 2001 to 2009, which required both managerial skills and understanding of issues to be discussed.
- arranged top government officials (Ministerial level) to speak in the forum as keynote speakers and took minutes in English and Indonesian (2000-2009)
- raised funds for various MASTEL's projects 2003-2009
- developed network and good relationships among stakeholders of telecommunications, broadcasting, and IT sectors (2000-2009) – particularly those outside MASTEL community such as broadcasting trainers, NGOs, etc. (2000-present)

- Attended workshop organized by Australia Communications Authority – the regulator for telecommunications sector in 2002 where she learned about telecommunications legal framework and regulations of Australia.
- Cyber law Course in 2001 organized by the University of Indonesia
